ChaiYarTit became a quadriplegic as a result of a motorcycle accident. He has been well cared for by the home care team and has become an excited believer in Jesus through their witness in the course of his care. Our Lanternlight team have visited for physio, etc. But he's been in bed so I realized it was time to get him up and out. We talked about goal setting and aimed for 1 month to take him out for a meal at a restaurant. Here's his first time up in a wheelchair!! On day 31 we took him out for cake and ice cream in a local shop but our meal plans were a bit derailed by COVID cases - we'll do it soon !!



Janapar - the girl you saw in our May Mission Month video. She was so shy she wouldn't respond to our attempts at hearing tests. But our second visit made us friends & found she does have just a little hearing. So then came the chance to continue her schooling at the deaf school (she has missed so much at the regular school). She'd indicated to her Mum she didn't want a regulation short-hair cut but the next time we visited - look !! Short hair!! She's getting excited & due to start in August. We'll take her for hearing testing and, if suitable, a hearing aid will be a great help.



SoeOoWah is 2 and has cerebral palsy. Mum was either holding him or lying him on the floor. The pram from the wheelchair people has been awaiting a suitable owner so now he'll be able to sit and see the "world" while mum is occupied. Physio training is important but even more important is to try to get Mum to see the value and continue it constantly. If she does, there is a hope he may walk but her role is vital.
