SAVE MANIPUR DAY OF PRAYER

The Asia Pacific Baptist Federation (APBF) calls on authorities in India to stop ongoing violence in the North Eastern state of India, especially Manipur, where more than 120 people have been killed, 250 places of worship have been destroyed or damaged and up to 50,000 people displaced, and more than 1,700 homes seriously damaged or destroyed since violence flared up in Manipur.

Conflict between the Kuki-zo, a predominantly Christian ethnic group in Manipur, and the Meitei, who are mostly Hindu, began as a political dispute over land rights.

Riots first broke out in response to May 3rd protests calling on the government to grant scheduled tribe status to the Meitei people.



Scheduled tribes have constitutionally granted property protection, and tribal members have access to political representation, educational assistance, and affirmative action in employment.

We pray for restoring of calm and inclusive dialogue involving civil society and the affected communities. We also pray for the ongoing religious freedom crisis we are seeing throughout India. It's long past time for India to not only address the situation in Manipur, but also eliminate any laws and policies that obstruct freedom of religion. Our prayers are with the people of India.

APPEAL FOR PEACE

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ, I might pray for PEACE in Manipur, but I will need to consider first the ground reality of pain, suffering and hopelessness looming over thousands of men, women, and children in Manipur.

Even for spiritually mature Christians, it is unbearable to suppress their intense hurt feeling and talk about forgiveness and reconciliations. I am wondering about the majority who are either spiritually infant or, others who do not have a personal relationship with Jesus, how would they even consider our appeal for peace. Even for distant audience the burning of several religious sanctuaries, education institutions, and other institutions that served all communities, do not make any sense. How much more insane it is for the innocent victims whose beloved is killed and sole property is burned? In a situation like this what is the obvious option do the victims are left with?

It is not hushing the injustice, ignoring the pain inflicted, burying the issues unresolved, and leaving the sin unpunished. Peace in the Bible demands the righteous to face the evil boldly without becoming the evil one.

What is the win-win solution for Christians in Manipur? Hatred, retaliation and initiating violence will only enhance the disaster and the Evil one alone shall win. Therefore, instead of one appeal for Peace, I would like to make four appeals for ACTIONS:

First, I must appeal for all kinds of help to the victims—financial, emotional, and spiritual—anything that might restore their life. In fact,



some Baptist Churches in the Northeast already did a wonderful job, but the need is enormous.

Second, I must appeal each community to withdraw from making any insensitive, provocative, derogatory comment against other, rather speaking words of regrets and sympathy for those who are suffering.

Third, I must appeal that all civilians must refrain from taking law in their hand and allow the legal machinery

to function smoothly in Manipur. If they want to act, they may rather volunteer to sacrificially build and restore the burnt religious and educational institutions as a symbol of restitution.

Fourth, I must appeal to all political, social, religious leaders and also, the bureaucrats to act boldly and justly according to provisions in the law. Peace of God is assured where human beings love and act justly to each other.

May our good Lord give us wisdom and courage to all the leaders in Manipur.

SAVE MANIPUR PRAYER FOR PEACE



1. Pray for restoration of peace in Manipur.

2. Pray for the State & Central government to call for peaceful dialogue and find a permanent solution immediately.

3. Pray for the Internally Displaced Person (IDP) for their rehabilitation and healing (physical, emotional & spiritual).

4. Pray that this genocide against the tribal Christians in Manipur will stop.

5. Pray for the Christians in Manipur whose churches have been completely burnt down and destroyed.

6. Pray for those who have lost their family, relatives, friends, and for those who have lost all their properties in Imphal (houses, cars, household items, clothes, children's education books, educational certificates, land/property documents – are either burned or destroyed. houses, vehicles, etc).

7. Pray for strength for the Meitei Christians during this challenging time to their faith.

8. Pray for spiritual awakening amidst this crisis and strength to overcome the terrible trauma for the families (parents and children).

9. Pray for Christian leaders who escaped this violent conflict - to be strong in the Lord as they lead their people during this crisis.

10. Pray for the Manipur Churches - to provide comfort, relief, forgiveness, reconciliation ministry.

Evangelical Baptist Convention (EBC)

1. Pray for the return of normalcy and peace in Manipur.

2. Pray that the destruction of more than three hundred churches in Imphal valley will not dampen the faith of Christians rather they will grow stronger wherever they are resettled.

3. Pray for healing and strength to forgive the enemy where more than one hundred innocent tribal Christians have been killed.

4. Pray for the many people who are in the relief centres whose future have become uncertain. While some of the displaced peoples can leave the relief centres to start a new life, there are still many who cannot leave the centres as they lost everything including land and houses.

5. Pray that the Evangelical Baptist Convention whose core value is to bring the gospel to others and plant self-reliant churches will send out missionaries to the rest of the world. Four missionaries have been commissioned to go, including one couple to overseas.



PRAY FOR MEMBER BODIES IN THE APBF! Nepal Baptist Church Council (NBCC)

1. NBCC plans to "Baptist House Building concept" pray for all the management and financial needs.
